President's Message

From developing a voluntary motor surveyor accreditation scheme to the launch of a public awareness campaign against fraud, we continue to steward the insurance sector through initiatives that strengthen consumer safeguards, standards and practices, as well as ethical conduct across the industry.

As we reflect on both the challenges overcame, and achievements celebrated in this past year, the GIA has remained steadfast, piloting the insurance sector towards new horizons of excellence.

I'm pleased to share that our unwavering dedication has yielded a stable and successful environment for our community, demonstrating the strength and adaptability of our industry.

This year has been significant for our sector, especially in terms of elevating operational efficiencies and optimising processes for our members and consumers. We also made advancements in the promotion of ethical culture and conduct, maintaining and elevating standards of integrity and professionalism in our sector.

GIA, together with participating industry bodies and associations, strengthened professional standards of motor surveys through the development of a voluntary accreditation scheme. This framework came out of an extensive landscape survey to understand regulatory regimes across countries. The GIA Motor Surveyor Workgroup was established as a direct result of this report and has been pivotal in devising recommendations for a voluntary accreditation scheme for motor surveyors in Singapore—a move that propels Singapore's motor surveyor standards to the forefront.

Along with this development, our progress in industry culture and conduct also took a leap forward with the publication of a best practice paper on 'Promoting Ethical Culture and Conduct in Insurance Intermediaries (General)' in January 2024. These guidelines highlighted in the paper are best practices for general insurance intermediaries in maintaining and elevating standards of integrity and professionalism, which I trust that each of us in the industry is upholding. Ultimately, our commitment as an industry is to build sustained customer trust and confidence in the sector.

In tandem, the Insurance Culture and Conduct Steering Committee (ICCSC) also released findings of its first trust indicator survey in July 2023, furnishing critical insights and significantly bolstering our ongoing endeavours to elevate trust and professionalism across the sector.

On the consumer front, we spearheaded a public education initiative by launching a commercial that tackled the pernicious issue of road touts. This campaign, the first unified sectoral move since the Motor Claims Framework in 2008, manifests our collective objective to make motor insurance both accessible and secure from fraudulent incidents. By shedding light on the modus operandi and associated risks of road touts, we reassert our pledge to safeguard the interests of all consumers.

The GIA Fraud Management System underwent a notable upgrade with the introduction of five new scenarios. 

IMPROVING PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS AND OPTIMISING PROCESSES FOR THE MOTORING PUBLIC



We developed a voluntary accreditation scheme for motor surveyors with the Singapore Automobile **Appraisers** Association, Singapore Centre of Institute of Automotive Engineer Assessors, Singapore Motor Cycle Trade Association, and Singapore Motor Workshop Association.

A. DELIVERING POSITIVE IMPACT FOR THE MOTOR INSURANCE SEGMENT

IMPROVING PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS AND OPTIMISING PROCESSES FOR THE MOTORING PUBLIC

VOLUNTARY ACCREDITATION SCHEME FOR MOTOR VEHICLE SURVEYORS

In January 2023, the Motor Surveyors Workgroup was formed to review the recommendations of the Motor Surveyors Landscape Survey report, landscape survey commissioned by GIA to explore the regulation and accreditation of motor surveyors.

The Motor Surveyors Workgroup comprised representatives from motor insurers, the Singapore Automobile Appraisers Association (SAAA), the Singapore Centre of Institute of Automotive Engineer Assessors (SCIAEA), the Singapore Motor Cycle Trade Association, and the Singapore Motor Workshop Association.

As part of its mandate, the workgroup was tasked to propose ways to implement recommendations discussed in the landscape survey report, consider the professional learning and development of motor surveyors, regulatory and stakeholder engagement, and the accreditation and licensing framework of motor surveyors.

In September 2023, the workgroup concluded its proposal and developed details of the proposed voluntary accreditation of motor surveyors. A Consultation Paper was published to gather views from GIA members, members of participating associations and external stakeholders including the Land Transport Authority and the State Courts.

The workgroup's proposal for SAAA to serve as the accreditation body of the voluntary accreditation was accepted by the GIA Management Committee (MC) in February 2024. SCIAEA will be the first approved assessment centre providing training and education for motor surveyors' voluntary accreditation in line with the industry standards.



SAAA in collaboration with SCIAEA will develop details of the prerequisite course, assessment test, and Continuing Professional Development courses.

The voluntary scheme is expected to be launched by end-2024.

MYINFO REPORTING INTEGRATION FOR MOTOR ACCIDENT REPORTING

By end-2024, motorists will be able to use Myinfo to initiate and pre-fill motor accident reports online before heading to Approved Reporting Centres (ARC) following an accident. Myinfo is a personal data management platform for citizens and residents, and is authenticated through Singpass.

This integration enables seamless retrieval of validated personal data for a faster reporting experience at an ARC. Through automating the verification process, motorists can benefit from having accurate particulars imported from their Myinfo profile, and cut down waiting time at ARCs.

This new service also aims to optimize the motor accident reporting process, saving motorists the hassle and worry of having to remember personal details when manually filling out a motor accident report. By securely authenticating their information through Myinfo, motorists can be assured of providing accurate information when completing a motor accident report.

With the Myinfo integration, motorists will experience an enhanced and expediated motor accident reporting process. Using Myinfo reporting is expected to become the default motor accident reporting process moving forward.



INTERAGENCY-GIA TASKFORCE FORMED TO LOOK INTO CLAIMS AGAINST FOREIGN VEHICLES AND ACCIDENT NON-REPORTING

Recognising prevailing feedback from motor insurers and the motoring public on insurance claims involving accidents with foreign vehicles, an Interagency-GIA Taskforce comprising members from motor insurers, LTA, and the Ministry of Transport was formed in 2023.

The taskforce expects to study recurring issues, feedback from stakeholders and propose solutions to address issues around insurance claims involving foreign vehicles as well as the persistent challenge of the non-reporting of motor accidents by motorists.

It expects to explore and bridge potential differences in motor insurance cover between Singapore and the neighbouring regions, and develop potential solutions to alleviate current challenges faced in motor insurance claims between local and foreign motorists.

The taskforce expects to convene in 2024.





CULTIVATING PUBLIC TRUST AND CONFIDENCE

B. EMBEDDING CULTURE AND CONDUCT STANDARDS IN INTERMEDIARIES AND INDUSTRY

MAINTAINING PUBLIC TRUST AND CONFIDENCE

REVISED GENERAL INSURANCE AGENTS' REGISTRATION REGULATIONS (GIARR) 2024

The GIARR was first implemented on 1 Oct 1990 to promote enhancement of standards and professionalism of the general insurance agents and the insurance industry. It subsequently went through several revisions with key changes made in 2005, 2007, 2009, 2015, and 2020.

The GIARR 2024 was implemented on 1 March 2024 to align the GIARR to new policies, reflect current business practices, and add clarity to existing regulations.



IMPLEMENTATION OF AGENTS'
REGISTRATION BOARD'S (ARB)
PREMIUM PAYMENT RULES

The ARB Premium Payment Rules were fully implemented in 1 March 2024. Applying to both personal and commercial insurance products, the guidelines specifies that customers buying insurance through general insurance agents should pay insurance premiums directly to their insurer and not to their agent.

Customers who are asked to pay insurance premiums to their agent or any other entity besides their insurer should ask their agent for a written or electronic document stating the reasons.

The guidelines apply universally with the only exceptions to the guidelines being scenarios where customers pay their motor insurance premium together with the cost of their vehicle(s) and where telecommunications or communication service providers (telco) bills and collect home insurance premiums from customers under telco bills.



INAUGURAL INSURANCE TRUST INDEX SURVEY (ITIS)

In July 2023, the Insurance Culture and Conduct Steering Committee (ICCSC) announced findings of its inaugural ITIS. The annual study, which will be conducted by an external consultant over a three-year period, is part of the ICCSC's efforts to assess the levels of trust in the insurance industry and identify areas where consumers and businesses' trust in life insurers, general insurers, and insurance intermediaries in Singapore can be improved.

The 2023 debut study surveyed over 2,000 consumer and more than 500 business employees (managerial-level and above) in Singapore between February to March 2023. Study findings showed that that consumers and businesses have good levels of trust in the insurance industry, with trust scores in the moderate to strong range.

The ICCSC aims to study the findings of the survey and work closely with stakeholders, including the insurance associations, to maintain and elevate trust levels in the insurance sector.

The ITIS will also be conducted in 2024 and 2025 to monitor shifts in consumers and businesses' sentiments, benchmark year-on-year performance, and identify key improvement areas to continuously build trust in Singapore's insurance industry. This is in keeping with the ICCSC's broader goal to elevate culture and conduct standards in the industry.



PROMOTING ETHICAL CULTURE AND CONDUCT IN GENERAL INSURANCE (GI) INTERMEDIARIES

The ICCSC released its fourth best practice paper on improving standards of ethical culture and conduct in general insurance intermediaries in January 2024.

The set of guidelines outlines best practices for GI intermediaries in maintaining and elevating standards of integrity and professionalism to build customer trust and confidence in the sector.

The paper follows the first set of three papers released in 2022 focusing on Human Resources, Corporate Governance and Life Insurance Intermediaries.



UPDATING THE DATA LOSS PROTECTION GUIDELINES FOR INSURANCE AGENTS

In October 2023, the Insurance Standing Committee for Cyber Security (ISCCS) incorporated an advisory on addressing risks arising from the theft and misuse of individuals' personal particulars into the Data Loss Protection (DLP) Guidelines.

The DLP guidelines aims to provide insurance agents with the basic requirements for managing and handling sensitive information and promote the adoption of these requirements.

In April 2023, the association sent a memo reminding members of the MAS Circular on addressing risks arising from the theft and misuse of an individual's personal information. Members, and their agents, were also asked to adopt security principles set out in the circular.

Following the advisory set out in the MAS Circular, the ISCCS separately reviewed and agreed to incorporate the advisory into the DLP guidelines. This was approved by the GIA MC in September 2023.

ELEVATING MEANINGFUL DIALOGUE AND CONNECTIONS

PRESIDENT'S CERTIFICATE OF COMMENDATION (COVID-19) IN RECOGNITION OF THE SECTOR'S CONTRIBUTIONS IN THE FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19

In June 2023, the association received on behalf of members, the President's Certificate of Commendation (COVID-19) [Sijil Kepujian Presiden (COVID-19)] in recognition of the sector's contributions in Singapore's fight against COVID-19.

The President's Certificate of Commendation (COVID-19) was awarded to organisations and teams that made exceptional efforts which had a significant impact in Singapore's fight against COVID-19.

The award recognised organisations for going above and beyond what was expected of them in contributing expertise and resources so that Singapore could mount the strongest possible national response to COVID-19.

We credit our member insurers for this award and their staff who came together and supported policyholders, the community, and the public during a time of crisis.

Our members rallied together and supported the nation's fight through initiatives as such:

 Issuing early-stage sector-wide consumer advisories on travel insurance claims eligibility.



- Announcing that outpatient telemedicine, hospital cash and group insurance coverage would be extended to COVID-19 patients.
- Collaborating with MAS to extend financial relief support measures to help individuals and SMEs through flexible installment payment plans for their general insurance policies, allowing them to maintain their insurance protection.
- Working with the LTA to provide insurance options for Malaysian-registered vehicles, ensuring that they had valid motor insurance to cover the entire period of their extended stay in Singapore during the "circuit breaker" lockdown period.
- Expeditiously adapting and digitising work processes, allowing the sector to continue safely servicing customers throughout the lockdown period.

Developing and offering new inbound travel insurance products to restart travel to Singapore.

CONTINUING PROACTIVE DIALOGUE WITH TRAFFIC POLICE

Following the change in command at Traffic Police (TP), a joint TP-GIA dialogue with its new Commander was held to discuss recent developments of interest and exchange views on case studies, emerging trends and public safety issues.

The meeting was attended by representatives from the Motor Committee, TP, and the secretariat. It continues GIA's well-established partnership with TP. This continues the GIA's longstanding partnership with TP, a key collaborator to improve safety and education for all road users.




ENGAGING THE MARITIME AND PORT AUTHORITY OF SINGAPORE (MPA) ON ELECTRIC HARBOUR CRAFTS (E-HC)

In July 2023, the MPA issued an Expression of Interest (EOI) to design and develop best-in-class e-HC reference designs for commercialisation in Singapore. The EOI expressed the MPA's ambitions to support operators of harbour crafts to meet the national climate target by achieving net zero emissions by 2050.

Following a consultation with GIA, MPA issued a follow-up EOI inviting financiers and insurance providers to submit proposals on financing and insurance solutions to support the adoption of e-HC in Singapore. For the insurance component of this second EOI, participants were asked to propose insurance solutions to address elements of operating e-HC. Such insurance solutions include Hull and Machinery and/or protection and indemnity.

Insurance solutions proposed may be adopted or adapted by MPA for other aggregated types of electric or net-zero fuelled vessels in future.

INPUT ON THE COMITÉ MARITIME
INTERNATIONAL'S REVISION OF THE
1910 COLLISION CONVENTION

In April 2023, the GIA Marine Insurance Committee (MIC) reviewed and provided its input on the Comité Maritime International's (CMI) Revision of the 1910 Collision Convention.

The 1910 Collision Convention is a multilateral treaty that established the rules of legal liability that result from collisions between ships at sea and was the first convention adopted by CMI and is in force in many countries.

Recognising the need to modernise the 1910 Collision Convention, the CMI conducted a questionnaire with participating countries and jurisdictions. In particular, the questionnaire also considered the need for changes to the 1910 Collision Convention in respect of maritime autonomous surface ships.

On behalf of the sector, the MIC reviewed the questionnaire and expressed our policy position to the questionnaire.

PARTICIPATING IN THE CORRUPT PRACTICES INVESTIGATION BUREAU'S ANTI-CORRUPTION PARTNERSHIP NETWORK

In March 2023, the association accepted the invitation to join the Corrupt Practices Investigation Bureau's (CPIB) Anti-Corruption Partnership Network (ACPN).

As part of its engagement efforts, the ACPN was established by the CPIB with private sector organisations to promote collaboration and ownership on the prevention of corruption in the private sector.

As a member of the ACPN, GIA will leverage this platform to raise awareness, exchange best practices on anti-corruption with other like-minded partners, and foster anti-corruption and integrity standards at the organisation-level.





MITIGATING AND DETERRING FRAUDULENT ACTIVITY



We produced a television commercial to raise consumer awareness on road touts and the consequences of engaging them.



We enhanced the Fraud Management System (FMS) to include five new scenarios for travel insurance.

D. MULTI-DISCIPLINARY APPROACH TO INSURANCE FRAUD

MITIGATING AND DETERRING FRAUDULENT ACTIVITY

TELEVISION COMMERCIAL ON ROAD TOUTS PRODUCED TO PROMOTE CONSUMER EDUCATION WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE SINGAPORE POLICE FORCE.

In October 2023, GIA completed the production and circulated TVC produced to raise consumer awareness of the modus operandi of road touts and the consequences of engaging them. This TVC marks the first time since the introduction of the Motor Claims Framework in 2008, where a sector-wide publicity campaign was introduced to mitigate inflated motor insurance claims.

In November 2023, GIA received the police's support of the TVC with its logo and preferred advisory reflected in the TVC.

The TVC, produced in 30- and 60-seconds versions, features a storyline reflecting a car owner's experience engaging with a road tout following an accident and the consequences of inflated insurance claims.

Reinforcing the crime prevention message that aiding or abetting the making of fraudulent claim is a crime, the commercial reminds motorists to be vigilant and cautious to avoid falling victim to malicious touts and workshops.

ENHANCEMENT OF FRAUD
MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (FMS)
TRAVEL INSURANCE MODULE

In April 2023, the travel insurance module of the FMS was further enhanced to increase the robustness of its detection mechanisms. Five new claim scenarios were introduced and implemented on the system, allowing it to detect potentially fraudulent insurance claims to a higher degree of accuracy and deliver even more reliable detection results.

The five new claim scenarios add a wider range of indicators, allowing the FMS to better identify unusual patterns and anomalies that point to potentially fraudulent claim activity.

A feedback and training session was conducted in September 2023 to guide users on the newly added claim scenarios and collect their input on these new system enhancements.

COLLABORATING WITH THE POLICE TO ALERT POLICYHOLDERS TO THE LTA ONEMOTORING PHISHING SCAM

In January 2023, we worked collaboratively with the Singapore Police's Commercial Affairs Department and motor insurers to disseminate an advisory video, alerting policyholders to an LTA OneMotoring phishing scam that was being carried out.

In this scam, victims would receive text messages purportedly from LTA notifying them of unpaid bills or fines and would be directly to click to an external fraudulent link embedded in the message. After victims are asked provide their banking details and one-time passwords, they would subsequently discover unauthorised transactions made with their cards.

The advisory video informed consumers on how the scam was being carried out and what they should do to prevent being a victim of the scam. Consumers were educated on how to authenticate legitimate messages from official sources and websites, to never disclose personal or banking information to anyone, and to report any fraudulent credit/debit card charges to their banks immediately.

This joint effort showcased the importance of close collaboration between key stakeholders in fighting and preventing fraud and scams.

EMPOWERING PROFESSIONAL GROWTH THROUGH TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

DEVELOPING INTEGRATIVE MARINE INSURANCE EXPERTISE

Collaboratively launched as a joint initiative between the Singapore Maritime Foundation and GIA in 2007, the Marine Knowledge Shipping Sessions (MKSS) remains one of GIA's signature professional training and development programme.

Into its 16th year in 2023, the MKSS seminar series continues to explore a diverse array of emerging trends, topics, and business challenges from marine insurance, shipping and global maritime trade.

Three MKSS seminars were held in 2023 covering a range of timely topics.

MKSS 47 - Greenhouse Gases and Alternative Fuels

Examining a shipping line's perspective and approach to decarbonisation, an underwriter's outlook on the decarbonisation of shipping, and an academic's views on the role of the maritime sector in a net-zero world.







MKSS 48 - War Risks

A look at the challenges brought about by changes in war risks insurance markets to shipowners, legal implications from the Russia-Ukraine war on war risks marine insurance cover, and how brokers are helping their clients navigate emerging concerns on war risks insurance.









A breakdown of the annual global marine insurance statistics focusing on developments across the marine hull, cargo, protection & indemnity, and energy segments. This session also saw speakers discuss current challenges faced by hull and war underwriters globally in the face of increasing geopolitical conflicts and tensions as well as legal and liability aspects of the latest IUMI 2023 annual statistics.







LAUNCH OF THE NAVIGATOR

In January 2023, the first edition of The Navigator was exclusively launched on GIA's LinkedIn. This marine insurance and maritime focused newsletter is an endeavour by the GIA Marine Insurance Committee to deliver timely updates and thought opinions on Singapore's marine insurance, maritime, and shipping segments to the insurance community. This initiative was founded on the objective enhancing the community's decision-making capabilities to stabilise and thrive businesses amidst the transient and dynamic nature of global maritime trade.

Initially launched to publish half-yearly, the newsletter was reintroduced in 2024 to publish on a more frequent cycle. The newsletter is currently in its fourth edition.



CONSTRUCTION & ENGINEERING MARKET PRESENTATIONS

Initiated by the GIA Construction and Engineering (C&E) Workgroup, the C&E market presentation series was first launched in 2018 and has cemented its position as the one of the leading professional seminars for underwriters in the engineering, property, and construction business segments.

C&E Market Presentation 22 - Portfolio Management

A study of the mechanics of portfolio management, levers used to manage portfolios, and the impact of market conditions on portfolios. The seminar also looked at the geopolitical and macroeconomic impacts, emergence of new and unexpected claims, claims inflation, turbulence in treaty reinsurance markets as well as political and regulatory changes.



<u>C&E Market Presentation 23 – What Next in the Market in Challenging Times?</u>

An analysis of the current situation, challenges and exposures in the world of engineering insurance. This session also heard views from the reinsurance market on treaty outcomes of the 1/1 renewals.







<u>C&E Market Presentation 24 – Warranties – what are they, how</u> do they work, and what are the challenges with them?

A look at Manufacturer's Warranty and the impact of warranty coverage provided by Original Equipment Manufacturers on construction projects, and replacement equipment for operational policies.


